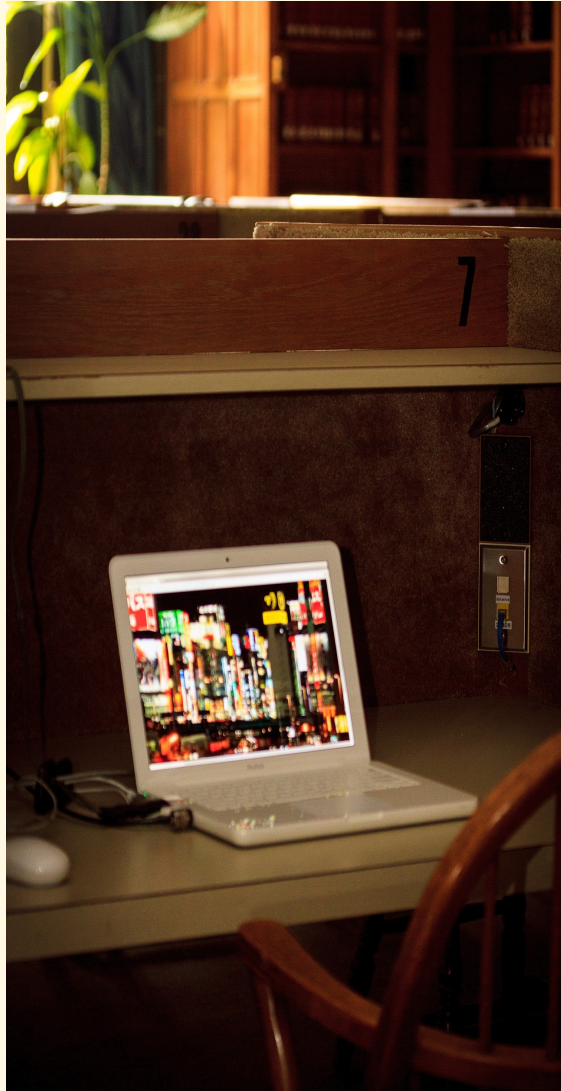

Program Description
